We have been working in the Republic of Georgia for a number of years, assisting their Minister of Education implement and open the first community college in the country. The Grand Opening is scheduled in October, and CCID will be present at the event.

A number of CCID member colleges have partnered on this initiative to date. Eastern Iowa Community College (Muscatine) received an HED grant, and Waukesha County Technical College, Wisconsin, has written a follow-on proposal to USAID – incredible efforts by these two institutions. Other colleges that have had a role include Santa Fe CC in Florida, Moraine Valley CC in Illinois, Kirkwood CC in Iowa, and Selkirk College in Canada.
